THE MEMBERS OF THE D.C. STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION PRESENT THE
FOLLOWING RESOLUTION

To Support the Creation of *“United States Public Service Academy”*

WHEREAS: The mission of the U.S. Public Service Academy is to build a corps of civilian leaders who have the “...moral character, academic training, and leadership experience necessary to serve the American people honorably and effectively, and who are committed to devoting their lives to public service.”; and

WHEREAS: The U.S. Public Service Academy is dedicated to creating a corps of civilian leaders willing to devote themselves to the pursuit of academic excellence, civic engagement, and leadership through public service; and

WHEREAS: The U.S. Public Service Academy strongly supports the Congress of the United States establishing this normal service academy in the District of Columbia where students would be able to get hands-on experience in public service through partnerships with local and federal government agencies; and


WHEREAS: Federal legislations S960 and H. R. 1671 have been introduced in the United States House of Representatives and Senate to create the United States Public Service Academy as America’s First National Civilian University.
